For Senior Future Problem Solving Students

This award is open to all CT Future Problem Solving students who are members of the senior class and plan to continue their education beyond high school. The objective of this program is to recognize FPS seniors for contributions, dedication and participation in the CT Future Problem Solving Program. It is not restricted in any other way. The award is up to \$500.00 for one year and will be paid directly to the student to help defray expenses during the first year of continuing education.

All items on the application must be completed and all information is considered confidential within the scholarship committee. The FPSofCT office must receive the application either electronically, by FAX, or by mail no later than 5:00 PM on March 4th. Late and /or incomplete applications will not be considered. Section 1. Program Participation

Form your ALoU essay as you wish, but address the following elements:

- Advantages found/gained through your FPS participation;
- Limitations or difficulties addressed while participating in FPS;
- How you were able to **overcome** (address or manage) these limitations;
- **Unique** opportunities, possibilities, or life experiences that were made possible through FPS or that will contribute to your future development and/or goals.

Section 4. Two Letters of Recommendation

These letters should be from people who are familiar with your involvement in the FPS program. One letter should be from a Future Problem Solving coach and the second letter may be from someone else, such as an affiliate director, another teammate, a teacher or someone else who can attest to your real-life application of the skills of Future Problem Solving. The letters of recommendation should focus on your involvement beyond participation in the competitions and should also address your character.

Criteria for Selection:

FPS Program Participation: 20%

Service to FPS: 20% ALoU Essay: 40%

Letters of Recommendation (2): 20% (10% each)

Scholarship results will be announced by March 15, and awarded at the Closing Ceremony of the FPSPofCT State Conference. If you are the recipient and cannot be present to accept the award, your coach may accept the award for you.
